

1. Reflect on your Knowledge

2. Limits of Confidentiality

When are you obligated to share relevant information about a child or family without their consent?





3. Limits of Confidentiality

Brainstorm and list the ways you maintain personal and confidential information about children and families. For example, pay attention to how information is collected, used, disclosed, retained and disposed. Are you familiar with sections of the Professional Misconduct Regulation that pertain to maintaining records and releasing information?
